An excerpt from the notice published by the Duchy of Cornwall on the 8th of September, 2022:



DUCHY of CORNWALL

It is with great sadness that we observe the demise of HM Queen Elizabeth II.

HM Queen Elizabeth II took a keen interest in the Duchy of Cornwall during both the reign of her father HM King George VI and in the early years of her own reign. Together with HRH The Duke of Edinburgh, she made a number of visits across the Duchy estate and attended Council meetings until her son, HRH The Prince of Wales came of age as Duke of Cornwall.

The passing of HM Queen Elizabeth II and the succession of HM King Charles III marks the transition of the title of the Duke of Cornwall to HRH The Duke of Cambridge. As such the estate is in safe hands. It is right at this time, to recognise the huge changes made by our 24th Duke of Cornwall over 70 years. His Majesty passes the estate on much improved.




The 25th Duke of Cornwall, William and the Duchess, Kate Middleton

The Duchy of Cornwall is a well-managed private estate, which was established by Edward III in 1337. The revenues from the estate are passed to HRH The Prince of Wales and Duke of Cornwall, who chooses to use them to fund his public, charitable and private activities and those of his family. The Duchy consists of around 53,000 hectares of land in 23 counties, mostly in the South West of England. The principal activity of the Duchy is the sustainable, commercial management of its land and properties. The Duchy also has a financial investment portfolio.

Dukes of Cornwall have traditionally managed their own estates. The Duchies of Lancaster and Cornwall (Accounts) Act 1838 gave the Treasury a role to ensure that actions taken by any Duke when managing the Duchy cannot compromise the long-term value of the estate. For this reason the Treasury must, for example, approve all property transactions with a value of £500,000 or more. The Duchy's annual accounts are laid before the House of Commons and the House of Lords so that Parliament can be satisfied that the Treasury is fulfilling its statutory responsibilities.





Cornwall Online Parish Clerk Database

The records in the Cornwall OPC (Online Parish Clerk) database have been transcribed by OPCs and volunteers from Cornwall Parish Registers and other sources. Access to the data-base is completely free of charge but we do have some annual costs to pay for website hosting.

These costs amount to several hundred pounds per year and we welcome donations from those who use the database (which can be found at

<http://www.cornwall-opc-database.org>).

The database has over 4.6 million transcribed records so surely there is some information about your family there. A team of OPCs can also provide assistance with research relating to a specific parish in Cornwall - free of charge.
