## President's Message

I've always been fascinated with names. As a Navy
Personnelman, I could recite the first, middle, and last names of every enlisted man in my squadron, as well as their mother's maiden name and their hometown. Fortunately, l've forgotten them after 55 years!

I recently acquired a 15 generation pedigree chart. With the help of Ancestry.com and MyHeritage.com, I've been able to find the names of over 125 ancestors to fill in the blanks. On my mother's side, they're all Cornish, as my grandparents emigrated from Cornwall in 1912.

On my grandfather's side, starting with his name, Uglow, there are 7 more names: Wonnecott, Cory, Chapman, Bray, French, Jolliffe, and Hobbs, dating as far back as 1679.

Grandmother, who was a Rosevear, had 13 additional names:
Langmaid, Lane, Phillips, Beall, Snell, Rescorla, Rogers, Lefebure, Stevens, Turner, Penhallgan, Sheer, and Darton.

Sometimes the spelling differed from generation to generation, as the early Cornish didn't have spellcheck! If you have any of these names in your line, who knows? We might be related!
